Editorial

A well deserved point from Newcastle visit

THE point we gained from Newcastle United at St. James Park last weekend was the third from away matches this season and a particularly good one considering the 800 miles trip.

It was our first visit to this famous ground for some years and Herbie Williams gave us a grand start with a goal within three minutes of the kick-off.

The football which our team played in that first twenty minutes could be compared with the best we have served up in recent years and had we made the most of our chances we should have had a commanding lead at half time. Instead we were in arrears by the odd goal in three rather unluckily.

For the first time this season the half back line showed real strength and understanding to give us territorial advantage and consequently the Newcastle forwards, despite a splendid performance by Ivor Allchurch, were not such an effective force as our own. Herbie Williams put us back on level terms with a grand goal that was hotly disputed by one or two of the Newcastle players, but the referee was in no doubt whatsoever.

ALL OUT OFFENSIVE

While the standard fell a little in the second half our lads maintained an all out offensive and it was good to see much of that old confidence return. We hope it will be even more pronounced in the return game with Derby County this evening.

When we were at the Baseball ground a fortnight ago, the County won a high scoring game by six goals to three.

Oddly enough we played some really good football, but some freak goals altered the whole course of the game. Our lads will have an opportunity to show that the result did not do us justice.

On the other hand County will be just as determined to win here.

The County, who had a 3-2 win over Preston North End last Saturday, are skippered by Swansea born Glyn Davies, who scored two of the three goals. They have collected nine points from eight games, having won one and drawn one away from home.

BIG DISAPPOINTMENT

The news of the cancellation of our European Cup winners cup match with Motor Jena came as a big disappointment not only to us as a club but we feel sure to our supporters as well.

Apart from the information we received from the Football Association, there have been unconfirmed reports which we hope will be clarified soon by the European union of Football Associations which governs the competition.

Our Welsh League team continues to dominate things. Their only defeat was at Newport, but they followed this up with 6-1 and 7-0 victories over Pontllanfraith and Merthyr.

On Saturday we have attractive opponents in Middlesbrough, who though without ace goal-getter Lrian Clough, are still a formidable side. We can as usual expect a hard struggle from Manager Bob Dennison's team as well as some entertaining football.

Derby County were one of the twelve original members of the Football League at its formation, but never won the senior championship. Their best in the First Division has been to finish runners-up, which they have done three times - in 1896, 1930 and 1936. They have been Second Division champions twice - in 1912 and 1915 - and runners-up once, in 1926. They have also spent two seasons in the Third Division in post war football, finishing as runners-up on the first occasion and champions twelve months later, in 1957.

Derby have made four appearances in the F. A. Final, the first three of them in the course of six consecutive seasons between 1898 and 1903, being beaten on each occasion. They won the trophy in 1946, however when they defeated Charlton Athletic 4 - 1 after extra time. In the 1903 final they were beaten 6 - 0 by Bury, which is the biggest defeat suffered by any club in the Cup's history in the last stage of all.

The goalscoring record for a season for the Midlands club is jointly held by two players. In 1930 - 31 season centre forward Jack Bowers scored 37 goals in the First Division, and this figure stands unbeaten today, though Ray Straw is now with Mansfield Town - equalled it in 1956 - 57, in the Third Division North. Jack Bowers' son John is on the present day staff at Derby.

When football was resumed after the last war Derby County had some of the finest players of that time on their books, including stars like Raich Carter, Peter Doherty, Jack Stamps, Vic Woodley, Leon Leuty, Chick Musson, Dally Duncan and others. But gradually, after finishing fourth one season and third the next, their team began to disintegrate and within seven years they had dropped to the Second Division. Two seasons later they were relegated to the Northern Section of the Third Division.

Since Ray Straw equalled the club's scoring record of 37 goals in 1956 - 57 no other Derby player has come any where near that figure in subsequent seasons. The highest in the last four years in 19 goals by centre-forward Bill Curry last winter.

CURRY, William Morton (Centre forward). Entered League football with his home town Club Newcastle United in season 1955/56, scoring 7 goals in 19 matches. During the following season he scored 25 times in 51 games. Has played for England (under 23 team). Scored 23 goals in 40 games while with Brighton. Transferred to Derby County on 30th September, 1960.

BARROWCLIFFE, Geoffrey (Full-back). A local boy who signed for Derby County while playing for Ilkeston Town in October, 1950. Played with the Reserve side the same season and made his Football League debut on 1st September, 1951 at the age of 19. Has also played in the centre-forward position.

YOUNG, Raymond (centre-half). A former England schoolboys and Derby Boys player who made his debut in the Football League at Doncaster in April, 1954. Signed as an amateur in May, 1949, turning professional in March, 1951. A cool constructive and intelligent player.

DAVIES, Glyn (Wing-half). Born in Swansea and was spotted while playing in Welsh junior football. Joined the Club in May, 1949, making his senior side debut at Rotherham in December, 1953. A forceful and strong tackling player and excellent Clubman.

PARRY, John (inside-forward). A member of a well-known Derby footballing family and attracted the Club's attention while playing for Derby Boys. Signed amateur forms in 1947 and turned professional in July, 1948, making his Football League debut in April 1949 when only 17 years old. Is equally at home at wing-half.

OXFORD, Ken (goalkeeper). Signed in December 1957 from Norwich City, but had previously played for Derby County as a trialist in 1948. Also played for Manchester City as an amateur. Representative honours in 3rd Division (South) when with Norwich.

UPTON, Frank (left-half). Joined the Club on transfer from Northampton Town in June, 1954. Has also played at left-back but the majority of his appearances have been at wing-half. A good, sound player who is cool under continuous pressure.

ADLINGTON, Terry (Goalkeeper). Discovered in a Sunday trial match organised by the Club, in November, 1955 and signed professional forms in December, 1955. (Part-time). Is now full-time player. Made his debut in the Football League against Crewe Alexandra in January, 1957.

BOWERS, John (Inside or wing forward). The son of Jack Bowers, former Derby County and England centre-forward, signed as a part-time professional in February, 1957. Had previously played regularly for his school team and also Derby Boys.

SWALLOW, Raymond (Inside or wing forward). Born in London and was transferred from Arsenal F.C., in September, 1958. Is a clever, scheming inside forward with a forceful shot. Is a keen cricketer and has played with the Derbyshire County Cricket Club.

MOORE, Leslie (Centre-half). Joined Derby County from the Midland League Club Worksop Town in November, 1957 and after three weeks made his senior side debut against Rotherham United at Millmoor Ground. Sheffield born, and is a big, strong and a forceful player who is rarely defeated in the air.

THOMPSON, Peter (inside or centre-forward). Signed from Hartlepool United on 7th November, 1958, having seen previous service with Wrexham during 1955/57 seasons. A player with plenty of craft and speed. Plays a lot of cricket during the close season.

CONWELL, Anthony (full-back). Signed from Huddersfield Town during June, 1959, having previously seen service with Sheffield Wednesday, during seasons 1949/54 and Huddersfield Town, 1955/59. A Bradford born player with plenty of Football League experience.

HALL, Ian William (inside-forward). Played as an amateur for Wolverhampton Wanderers but was subsequently recommended by his father and signed amateur forms on 18th August, 1958. Signed professional in September, 1959. Is another player who has also considerable success with the County Cricket side during the close season.
