A good win at Exeter last Saturday - entirely due to a fine second half fight back - was the right curtain-raiser for the visit of Arsenal. Maybe some of you will recall the kindness of the Gunners in playing at Vetch Field two seasons ago for Brian Hughes' Testimonial. To his friends from Highbury Brian sends best wishes via the U.S.A.

Meanwhile back on the League scene a milestone was reached when we entertained Barnsley here a fortnight ago. Vic Gomersall celebrated his first League goal for the Club and the 1-1 result marked Swansea Town's 400th draw in Football League matches.

Fans who are statistically minded might be interested to know that it has taken the Club 1,715 games over a period of 41 seasons to reach this mark. A breakdown of these 400 drawn games show that 290 were in the Second Division, 78 in the old Third Division & the remaining six in this season's Fourth Division campaign.



OUR VISITORS - ARSENAL

Jim FURNELL (Goalkeeper).

jim had his best season for Arsenal last season when he played in all 42 League games and has now made 112 League appearances. A native of Manchester, he signed for Arsenal on 22nd November, 1963 as a replacement for Jack McClelland, who had broken his arm in an early season game at Leicester. Had previously played with Burnley & Liverpool.
Peter STOREY (Full Back).

A product of England Schoolboys, Peter A product of England Schoolooys, Peter became an apprentice at Highbury in May, 1961, and signed professional in September 1962. He won his place in the League side in 1965-66, playing in 28 matches that season. Peter, who comes from Farnham has now made 62 appearances for Arsenal

Peter SIMPSON (Half Back).
Peter joined the Arsenal ground staff in May 1960, becoming an apprentice in October 1961. He comes from Gorleston in Norfolk and made his first appearance in the League team in the 1963-64 season. He has now made 51 appearances for Arsenal.

Frank McLINTOCK (Half Back).

A Scottish international, Frank was transferred from Leicester City to Arsenal in October, 1964, and has just topped the 100 mark for Arsenal, having played in 101 matches. Frank regained his place in the Scotland team last season on current form when he played agains tRussia.

Terry NEILL (Half Back)

Terry came to Arsenal on transfer from Bangor in Northern Ireland in December, 1959 when he had not reached 18.
He first appeared for Arsenal in a League match in the 1960-61 season, and has now made 164 appearances for Arsenal large for the season of the se enal. Only one current player, George Armstrong, has made more (167). Is an Irish International of considerable experience, and has captained his club & his country

Ian URE (Half Back).

Ian, already a Scottish International, joined Arsenal from Dundee on 22nd. August, 1963, and in that first season missed only one League game. In season 1964-65, Ian missed half the season because of an operation on his knee, & recently suffered the double misfortune of breaking his jaw twice, the second time having regained his place in Scotlands team. Has made 121 appearances for Argenal.

Bobby GOULD (Forward).

Recently signed from Coventry City F.C. and a native of that city. Owing to being cup-tied in the League Cup he is today making only his 3rd, appearance ris first was at Manchester City a fortnight ago when he laid on the only Arsenal goal for George Graham to score.

John RADFORD (Inside Forward).

John comes from Hemsworth, near Pontefract in Yorkshire and played for the local Youth Club before becoming an Arsenal apprentice in October, 1962. Became a full-time professional in February, 1964, and has now played 76 League games for Arsenal, scoring a hat-trick last season in the Fourth

Round Cup replay against Bolton.

George GRAHAM (Centre Forward).

George was signed for a high fee from Chelsea in October last when Tommy Baldwin went to Chelsea as part of the deal. George had previously played with Aston Villa. At Chelsea he gained Scottish Under-23 honours and has now made 33 League appearances for Ars-

Jon SAMMELS (Inside Forward).

Jon comes from Ipswich, and joined Arsenal as an apprentice in January, 1961 and became a professional in July 1962. He won England Youth caps and now has England Under-23 honours. Jon had his best season in 1966-67 when he played in every League match to give him a total of 93 appearances. George ARMSTRONG (Outside Left).

George, who won his first England-23 cap in 1964-65 comes from CountyDur-ham. He came to Highbury in August, 1961 for a trial as an inside-forward & signed professional. He has now played more League games than any other current player on the books — 167, so he should be heading for the 200 up!

David JENKINS (Inside Forward).

David became an apprentice in July, 1962 when he joined us after leaving school. He comes from Bristol and became a full-time professional in October, 1963. He has made very considerable progress with the Club and having played 25 times for the Combination side last season is on the fringe of the League side and may well make his debut this season.

SWANSEA v. ARSENAL THE PAST

This is our third meeting with Arsenal in the competition and both Clubs have a very good reason for looking upon today's encounter as being something of an omen.

Here in 1926 we won a sixth round tie 2-1 in a game that was memoraoie for the Arsenal goal, scored by Alex Mackie from his own half of the field. This was the season in which we reached the semi-final stage for the first time only to lose 0-3 to Bolton Wanderers at White Hart Lane, Tottenham.

Our second clash was in the fourth round at Highbury in 1950 and this time the Gunners were successful in reversing the result (and score) of the previous tie. Logic opened the scoring for Arsenal to give them an interval lead. They went further ahead early in the second halr when Barnes converted a penalty after Rory Keane had punched a header from Lewis over the bar with goalkeeper Jack Parry stranded. Frank Scrine reduced the deficit with a header and with the Swans striving to get on terms, Frank Burns found the net only to have his effort disallowed. The Arsenal then went on to dispose of Burnley. Leeds United and Chelsea before defeating Liverpool 2-0 in the Final.

It is interesting to recall that our two-inside forwards at Highbury were Billy Lucas (now our present manager) and a tall, willowy, fair-haired 20 year old who had played his first cup-tie for the Club only a few weeks previously against Birmingham City and had received rave notices in the Press — now 18 years later and with a distinguished and illustrious career behind him the wheel has turned full circle for Ivor Allchurch. The teams that day were:—
