Gordon William LIVSEY (Goalkeeper)
Was unfortunate to break his leg in his first game for the Club as a trialist from Kettering Town Football Club, Gordon made a remarkable recovery & forced his way into the first team position last season. Very Agile.

Alan BIRMINGHAM (Full Back)

This player is in his second spell at Wrexham, having assisted the Club as an Amateur before moving on to Skelmersdale United where he played in the Amateur Cup Final - unfortunately on the losing side.

Stephen Darrow STACEY (Left Back)
Steve was signed from Bristol City in February 1966, and has been a regular member of the first team at Wrexham since. A thoughtful player who likes to move up front whenever the opportunity presents itself.

David POWELL (Wing Half)

Gained a full International Cap last season when he assisted Wales against West Germany at Cardiff. David has wonderful speed of recovery & a great future is predicted for him.

Edwin Charles MAY (Centre Half)

Another close season signing, Eddie joined the Club from Southend United. A strong player who takes command in the air.

Terence Eugene BRADBURY

(Wing Half).
After playing for Chelsea, Southend United and Leyton Orient, Terry has now firmly established himself as a favourite of the Supporters of Wrexham Football Club.

Anthony BEANLAND (Wing Half)

Tony is in his second season at the Racecourse having previously played for Southend United, Blackpool and Southampton.

Ian MOIR (Outside Forward)

From Manchester United to Blackpool thence on to Chester and afterwards to Wrexham, is the colourful career of Ian Moir. A brilliant ball player of whom much is expected during the season at Wrexham.

Albert John KINSEY (Inside Forward)
Joined the Club from Manchester Utd. in March 1966. Born at Liverpool and is a great asset as a utility player.

Raymond Ogden CHARNLEY

(Centre Forward).
This close season signing has proved himself to be one of the most dangerous centre forwards in the game. He previously played for Blackpool and latterly assisted Preston North End from whom he was transferred to Wrexham.

Raymond James SMITH

(Centre Forward)
Another signing from Southend United, Ray was the Club's top scorer last season with 19 goals to his credit. Very good in the air and more than useful on the ground. A lot is expected of him again during the present season.

Dennis John REEVES (Goalkeeper)

Was signed from Chester during the middle of 1967/68 season. Dennis has proved beyond a shadow of doubt that he has the ability to be an outstanding goalkeeper. Also a more than useful cricketer.

Stephen Francis MACKRETH

(Full Back)
A youngster who joined the Club after assisting on the ground staff. Has the potential to become an outstanding player of the future.

George William SHOWELL

(Wing Half/Centre Half)
After having had considerable experience with Wolves & Bristol City, George moved to Wrexham in November, 1966. His shrewd reading of the game is a great asset to the Wrexham Defence.

Bernard Charles PURDIE

(Centre Forward)
A local boy who graduated from the Ground Staff to the professional ranks. Bernard has a flair for being in the right place at the right time. This season could see him making steady progress towards the first team.

Stuart James MASON (Full Back)

Joined Wrexham from Whitchurch Grammar School after playing for two seasons as an Amateur. Was transferred to Liverpool in October 1966 but found it difficult to establish himself there. After being loaned out to Doncaster Rovers he eventually returned to Wrexham during the close season.

Soccer Believe It or Not

Soccer and religion aren't often linked, but at one time or another Church, Bishop, Priest, Parson, Deacon, Elder, Vickers and Verger have been Football League professionals.

Bob Walker played for both Bradford clubs in turn before the war, and so did his son, Geoffrey, after it - the only case on record of father and son both turning out in the Football League with two clubs in the same City.

West Bromwich Albion had five players named Williams - Stuart, Graham, Mark, David and Geoffrey - on their staff in season 1957-58, but there was no relationship between any two of them.

When Wrexham gave centre-forward Bernard Evans his Football League baptism in an away match against Bradford City in September 1954, he scored within 25 seconds of the start - the quickest ever debutant goal.

Two brothers Arthur and Jack Rowley, with Leicester City and Plymouth Argyle respectively, both scored the 200th Football League goals of their careers on the same day - 22nd October, 1955. Arthur beat Jack to it by 12 minutes.

When Colchester United began their Football League career in season 1950-51 they collected 11 points from their first seven Third Division games, but added only one point from their next 10 matches.

Outside-left William Fenton was the only winger who ever scored twice as many goals as any other player for a team in two successive seasons. With York City in 1951-52 he hit 31 (next best 15); in 1952-53 he added 25 (10).

Only one goal in Football League history has gone into the permanent records as a joint affair. It was scored at Chelsea on 17th December, 1954. Leicester City's Stanley Milburn and Jack Foggatt kicked at the ball simultaneously and turned it into their own goal.

All the four First Division goals Huddersfield Town centre-forward Jimmy Glazzard scored against Everton on Easter Tuesday 1953 were headed in - and all four were obtained from centres by outside-left Vic Metcalfe.

When John and Mel Charles and Ivor and Len Allchurch all turned out for Wales against Ireland in April, 1955, they provided the first instance in this century of two sets of brothers appearing together for the same in a home international match.

ANSWERS

1. Bradford, whose first team operated in the Southern League and reserves in the North-Eastern League in season 1907-08.
2. Wolves left-half Ron Flowers, who, born on July 28th, 1934, was the oldest member of England's team against Wales at Cardiff on October 17th, 1959, though then only 25.
3. Only once. Manchester United, in winning the Cup in season 1947-48, knocked out six fellow members of the First Division: Aston Villa, Liverpool, Charlton Athletic, Preston North End, Derby County & Blackpool.
4. In 1930, when with Christmas Day falling on a Thursday, there were 40 Football League matches on that day, 42 on the Friday, and 44 on the Saturday (44 was the maximum at that time).
5. Two: Cardiff City, when they finished at the bottom of the Third Division South in season 1933-34, and Bradford City who were last in the Third Division North in 1948-49.
6. Crewe Alexandra (30 in season 1956-57), Southport (26 in 1958-59 and 1959-60), Norwich City (25 in 1956-57), and Portsmouth (24 in 1958-59).
