



A Record-breaking night

Swansea City 12, Sliema Wanderers 0

When Ante Rajkovic fired in No. ten from the right hand side of Sliema's penalty area, Swansea City had joined the select band of British clubs to reach double figures in a European Cup-winners' Cup match.

The round dozen turned out to be one short of the record for the highest score recorded by a British team - set up by Chelsea with their 13 - 0 win over the Luxembourg club Jeunesse Hautcharage in the 1971-72 competition.

Certainly it had never been done by a Welsh club before although there have been three other instances of English and Scottish teams taking their tally into double figures.

In 1974-75 Liverpool thrashed the Norwegians Stromsgodset 11-0 at Anfield. Dunfermline Athletic swamped Apoel Nicosia 10-1 in 1968-69 and Aberdeen hit ten without reply against Reykjavik of Iceland in 1967-68.

The Cup-winners' Cup record for the biggest win has stood since the autumn of 1963 when Sporting Lisbon of Portugal annihilated Apoel Nicosia 16-1. To score ten or more against any opposition is quite an achievement and we are understandably proud of the twelve we put past our Maltese guests here last month.

On the Other Side - Tottenham Hotspur

For much of last season, Tottenham Hotspur were in the running for four trophies - the First Division championship, the F.A. Cup, the Football League Cup and the European Cup-winners' Cup.

In the end they wound up with the F.A. Cup, thus emulating the achievement of Danny Blanchflower's double-winning Spurs of the early Sixties in winning the blue riband knockout trophy in successive seasons.

Elsewhere they did rather well, finishing fourth in the League, contesting the Football League Cup final only to lose 3-1 to Liverpool and failing to reach the Cup-winners' Cup final only because of Alan Simonsen's winner in the second leg in Barcelona.

All told, therefore, a quite outstanding season for the North London club in which they scored 95 goals from a total of 63 League and Cup matches. When it came to entertaining crowds, few teams did it better than Keith Burkinshaw's Spurs.

In the end they were probably punished for having too much on their plate but this season they will attempt to do it all over again and the signs point very clearly to another eventful season at White Hart Lane.

None of their results to date this season have been more impressive than the six-goal blitz of Southampton early last month when Ricky Villa marked the resumption of his League career with one of the goals. Away wins at Ipswich and Sunderland suggest that Spurs will run for the title again and they will take some stopping in the Cup-winners' Cup.

Spurs were the first English club to win the trophy back in 1963 and their 5-1 thrashing of Atletico Madrid in Rotterdam has long been accepted as a European classic. It was something in which Swansea could take a little pride because Cliff Jones was then at his prime as one of the great wingers of the world stage.

The present-day Spurs also have a dash of

Welsh flavour in the person of Paul Price. The current Wales captain is in his second season with the club, having featured in a major transfer from Luton Town during the summer of 1981.

Spurs' League record to date this season : Home : drew with Luton 2-2, beat Southampton 6-0, lost to Manchester City 1-2. Away : beat Ipswich Town 2-1, lost to Everton 1-3, beat Sunderland 1-0.

Steve Perryman, the reigning Footballer of the Year, is the third Tottenham player to have won the coveted award made annually by the Football Writers' Association.

Until the early part of last summer he was described in most quarters as one of the best players never to have been capped by England. The description is now somewhat out of date. Perryman having appeared as a substitute during the 1-1 draw against Iceland in Reykjavik last June.

The cap had been earned the hard way. An outstanding one-club player, Perryman broke Tottenham's appearance record set by Pat Jennings two seasons ago and has now figured in more than 600 Cup and League matches for the club. On top of that, he joins Jennings (1973-74) and Danny Blanchflower (1957-58 and 1960-61) as the only Spurs player to be elected Footballer of the Year.

RAY CLEMENCE (Goalkeeper). Born Skegness. One of the most successful players in the history of the game. Started with Scunthorpe, then went on to great things with Liverpool. Switched to London last season.

CHRIS HUGHTON (Full back). Born West Ham. A Republic of Ireland international who joined Spurs straight from school. Won his first cap in 1980.

PAUL MILLER (Defender). Born London. Another of Spurs' locally-produced players, he played in all but seven of last season's First Division matches.

PAUL PRICE (Defender). Born St. Albans. Eligible for Wales because of his father coming from Merthyr Vale. Signed from Luton for a substantial fee, he was made captain of Wales last season.

RICKY VILLA (Midfield). Born Buenos Aires. Joined Spurs with Ossie Ardiles immediately after the 1978 World Cup finals. Has now played nearly 150 League matches for the club, having returned recently from his homeland.

GLENN HODDLE (Midfield). Born Hayes. One of the most exciting players in the English game, he scored on his England debut, against Bulgaria at Wembley nearly three years ago.

GARY MABBUTT (Midfield). Born Bristol. Bought from Bristol Rovers during the close season, he is a

current Under-21 international and a former captain of England Youth. Marked his Spurs debut with a goal in the draw against Luton.

GARTH CROOKS (Striker). Born Stoke-on-Trent. Now in his third season after a £600,000 transfer from Stoke. Scored 18 goals last season but it would have been more had it not been for injury.

STEVE ARCHIBALD (Striker). Born Glasgow. Spurs' record signing at £800,000 from Aberdeen in May 1980. Began with Clyde and has been scoring goals ever since. A Scotland international.

TONY GALVIN (Striker). Born Huddersfield. Qualifies for the Republic of Ireland despite his Yorkshire birth. Played an increasingly prominent part in Spurs' success last season.





Memory Lane - HERBIE WILLIAMS

HERBIE WILLIAMS is the only post-war player apart from Ivor Allchurch to score a century of League goals for the Swans, his only professional club over a period of eighteen years.

A Welsh international, he played and coached for a short time in Australia before returning to Swansea where he lives with his wife Christine and sons Andrew (18), Simon (16) and Matthew (6). One of his ambitions was to play in the First Division and if he never quite got round to achieving it, Herbie takes great pride from the fact that his home-town club are now there, pitting their wits against the best in the country.

During his long career at the Vetch, Herbie Williams served under eight managers. Ron Burgess was in charge when he arrived as a 15-year-old straight from school and Harry Griffiths was running the show when he left.

In between, the manager's chair was occupied by Trevor Morris, Joe Sykes, Glyn Davies, Billy Lucas, Roy Bentley and Harry Gregg. "I had eighteen years at the club," he says, "Eighteen lovely years. Believe me, I enjoyed every minute."

"All I ever wanted was to be a consistent player. If you can play consistently over a fair period, then that's something. I like to think I was consistent over a good number of years."

The boy from Port Tenant began on the groundstaff towards the end of the 1957-58 season when the Vetch was bristling with such big names as Ivor Allchurch, Terry Medwin and Cliff Jones.

It didn't take long for the young Williams to make his mark. He made his League debut as a 17-year-old inside forward in a Second Division match against Sunderland in 1960 which the Swans won by the handsome margin of 5-0.

"I barely had a kick," he recalls, "But at least it was a start. Ivor Allchurch was brilliant that day. As I remember it, he scored four of the goals but I must have done something because they kept me in for the next seven matches."

Herbie went on playing League football until February 1975 when he bowed out in a Fourth Division match against Rotherham at Millmoor. By then he had become the first post-war player to reach 500 League appearances for the Swans and if it was still 85 short of Wilfred Milne's all-time record it was still more than enough to ensure him a permanent niche in Vetch folklore.

The consistency of which he spoke earlier was rewarded in the shape of three Welsh caps. "When somebody asked me what position I'd like to play for Wales, I said that I would play anywhere just for the honour," he says, "Playing for your country is something every player strives for."

Herbie made his three international appearances in different positions. For his debut, Wales chose him at No. 10 or inside left in the old-fashioned sense, against Greece in Athens in December 1964. For the return against the Greeks at Ninian Park the following March, Herbie was in the No. 4 shirt and when Wales picked him for the last time, against Rumania in Bucharest in November, 1971, it was as the centre half replacement for absent Mike England.

"Sadly, the internationals turned out to be a bit of a let-down," he says, "I had happier days at the Vetch and I suppose the famous F.A. Cup win at Liverpool in the quarter final has to be the highlight."

When he left the Vetch in the early part of 1975, Herbie went 'Down Under' to take up a player-coach appointment in the town of Wollongong near Sidney. He took his wife Christine and three sons with him but family homesickness for South Wales brought the Williamses home in 1976, back to Port Tenant.

Since then Herbie has been working as a postman and while he has always preferred playing to watching, his elder sons Andrew and Simon are regulars on the North Bank. They'll have been told by plenty of the more senior supporters that their father was some player . . . and a clubman second to none who in 18 years only once asked for a transfer. Trevor Morris tore it up, threw it into the wastepaper basket and told him: "You're not leaving here."

When the Swans beat Spurs, Ramsey, Ditchburn and all . . .

Four Welsh internationals and one from England are among the most prominent players to have worn the white of Swansea City and Tottenham Hotspur. The Welsh quartet are well-known — Ronnie Burgess, Ernie Jones, Terry Medwin and Cliffy Jones.

The England cap was Arthur Willis who went from the Vetch to White Hart Lane and made his solitary international appearance against France in 1952. There have, however, been other players involved in transfers between the clubs.

Before the Second World War the Swans swopped John Harris, now assistant manager of Sheffield Wednesday, for an inside forward called Joe Meek. John, who managed Sheffield United before switching to Hillsborough, didn't stay long at Spurs, moving to Wolves and then Chelsea.

Percy Hooper, an experienced goalkeeper, came here from Spurs in March 1946 but stayed only for twelve matches. Among lesser-known signings from Spurs was C.H.J. Handley who came in May 1929 for £500. At the end of the following season we sold him to Thames United, then a League club, for £50 which represented quite a depreciation!

Another of our players to end up with Spurs was Willie Davies of Cardiff City fame. More recently we had Mike Stead here on loan during the early part of 1976.

Apart from last season and our memorable matches in the Football League Cup, all our matches against Spurs have taken place in the Total

Second Division. Our last such encounter was on April 29, 1950.

Spurs were already assured of the Second Division championship and had beaten us 3-1 on their pitch earlier in the season. It seemed an away 'banker' and our cause wasn't helped by injuries to O'Driscoll, Keane, Kiley and Weston. A half-fit Reg Weston led a makeshift Swans team to a fine victory.

The only goal was scored within the opening two minutes by Frankie Scrine and Spurs, for all their skill, failed to break down our defence which at least ensured that most of the 16,417 spectators went home feeling very proud of their team's victory over opponents whose right back was none other than one Alf Ramsley.

Years later Burgess and Willis, both members of the Spurs team that afternoon, complimented us on the quality of our football. Here's hoping that the Spurs of today will feel obliged to repeat such a sentiment.


