





David Farmer writes...

In Retrospect **HEREFORD UNITED**

Having played Hereford United here at the Vetch in the Littlewoods Cup earlier this season, we have had one look back down memory lane with them. However, as I noted on that occasion, today is an historical day for both clubs in that we compete in a League match for the first time. Hereford came into the English League in season 1972 and since then we have both managed to avoid each other. Actually, for the Swans, this means that we will have met all ninety-two League teams in one divisional championship or another.

Since we have not played each other in League games there is nothing to note about that. However, on one occasion the United played us in circumstances which were closely related to our League success.

The match took place here at the Vetch on 4th May, 1981, and prior to the game (the first leg of the two-game final of that season) our players toured the packed ground to receive the plaudits of the 13,182 crowd. It was a happy evening for everyone, with the joy of promotion to Division One for the first time still ringing in our hearts. Another happy event that evening was the presentation to 'Jimmy' Hadziabdic of the player of the year trophy. 'Jimmy', one of the most popular

players we have ever had here, beamed with joy. He was, too, to play a part in ensuring that we won the game that night.

As far as United were concerned, they did not come here as sacrificial lambs. Even allowing for the fact that our lads must have found it difficult to psych themselves up for the game after the Preston match (two days before), United did well. So well, indeed, that we were happy to run out 1-0 winners. The scorer: Robbie James, who also scored in the 1-1 draw at Edgar Street which was the result of the second leg.

The teams for the Vetch match on that memorable evening were:—

Swans: Stewart, Evans, Hadziabdic, Robinson, Mahoney, Lewis, Curtis, James (R), James (L), Charles and Craig.

Hereford: Cashley, Price, Bartley, Hicks, Comes, Spring, Harvey, Laidlow, Showers, McCrellis, White.

Mention of the popular 'Jimmy' takes the eye/mind to the left-back in the Hereford side for that game. That's right, Danny Bartley: a player who gave us great service and contributed a great deal to our rise from the basement to the top. Hereford fans may not have seen him at his best but I am sure, like us, that they would salute him as a great 'Pro'.

The Managers

The Managers - No.16 **COLIN APPLETON**

Having failed to bring Colin Appleton to the Vetch during the previous season, the Swans' directors tried again in the May of 1984. Appleton had taken Hull towards the top of their Division the previous season. What was more pertinent, however, was that he had done it on a shoe-string; that was a credential which was essential at the Vetch at the time. The new manager signed a two-year contract on 16th May, 1984, but, as things worked out, he was to stay less than seven months of that period.

Whilst the financial position was difficult when Colin Appleton came to the Vetch, it was by no means his only problem. His biggest difficulty was the morale of his staff. At the time he came the Swans could boast at least six 'Internationals' and there were several promising young players, including Dean Saunders, Jimmy Loveridge and David Hough. The manager's problem was that he could not weld his men into an effective side. And, as he was to say later, he needed time; and, sadly, time was not a commodity in plentiful supply at the club at that point.

The team started badly, winning only one of its first seven games and, at the end of September, the Swans were 23rd in the table. They had scored only six goals whilst conceding fourteen. When the next game was won at Bournemouth (the first away vic-

tory for 46 attempts) things looked a little better. Four days later the team put an even better performance together to win 3-1 at the Vetch against Orient. Was this to be the beginning of a revival? The answer was 'no', for three further games were lost in quick succession before the next victory which, as it turned out, was the last under Colin Appleton's aegis.

By that time the confidence of the board and of the fans in the new manager was evaporating. After losing 1-4 at Doncaster in November, the Swans were soundly beaten 0-2 at the Vetch by Plymouth. Not only was the side losing, but, to coin an old Swansea phrase, there was 'no shape' about the play. Appleton, unable to buy or borrow, used many trialists during this period, signing them, as the papers put it at the time, 'out of the dole queue'. Names like Richardson, Cole, Wassell and Wellings appeared in the side, while an old English International, Gerry Francis, also signed at one point.

After the Plymouth defeat the chairman acted; Colin Appleton was sacked five days later.






