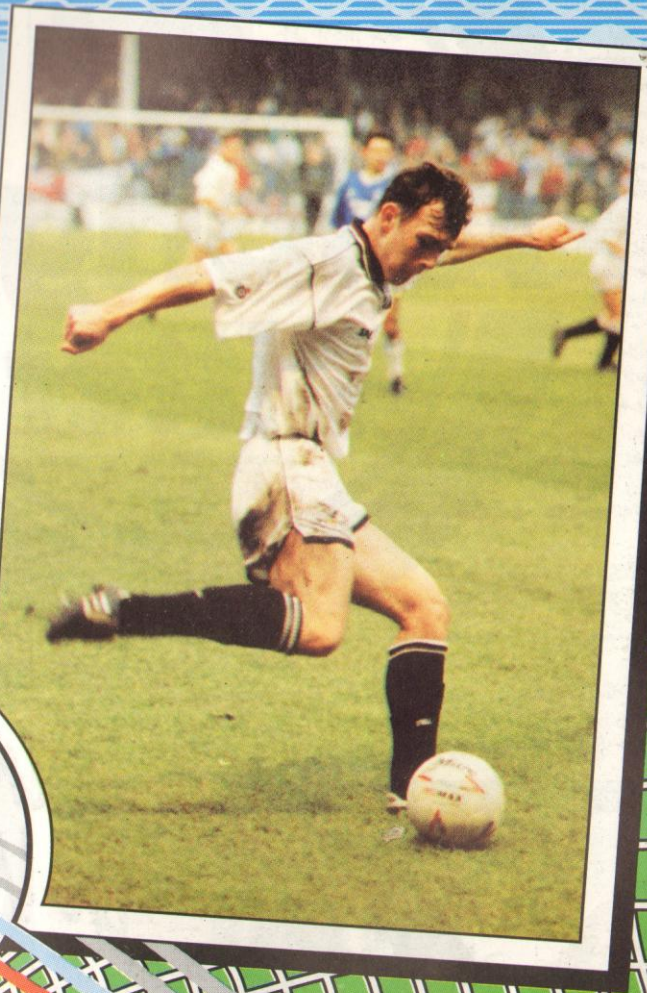

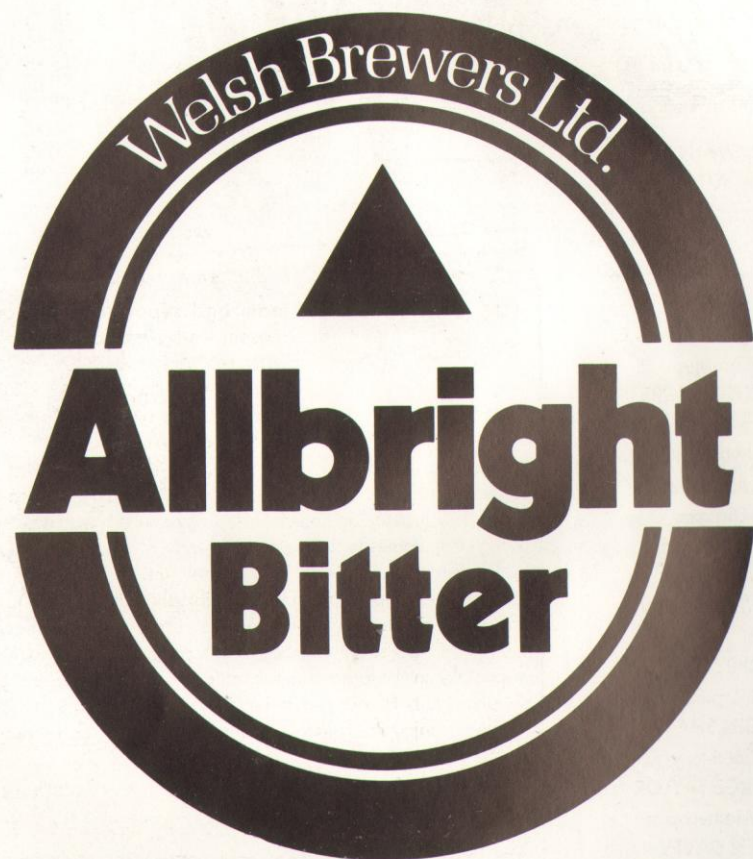

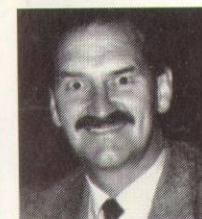

PROSE FOR THOUGHT

In sitting down to write this item for tonight's programme, that famous piece of rhetoric from Shakespeare's Henry Vth came to mind:-

"Once more to the breach dear friends..."

In the play the King urges his army to try once more to defeat their opponents, and, I suppose, the respective managers of our clubs will have had to do much the same over recent days. After all, this is the third meeting between the Swans and the Bluebirds this season and that total does not include the pre-season "friendly". So what might the managers find to say that is new?

It is true that since that pre-season game there have been several signings by both clubs, including the recent spurt at Ninian Park, where six new pairs of legs have been hired. Yet, whoever is on the field the clubs remain the same, as does the old rivalry (hopefully, now being restored to its former friendly sporting heritage).

However, there is the point, that this match is rather special.

Eddie May is on record as having said that it is akin to the Welsh Cup final; that is, whoever wins tonight's game will go on to take the Cup. That view is one which, if logic and League status is anything to go by, is not unreasonable. Yet the nature of Cup competitions based upon the "knockout" principle make the reality something less than a racing certainty. For example, Wrexham's amazing exploits this season in the English FA Cup (everyone in Wales should be delighted for them) demonstrates, yet again, the contrary nature of such games. And neither set of supporters needs reminding that teams of so-called inferior status have dumped both our clubs out of the Welsh Cup. Consequently, it is doubtful whether either manager would begin to take any future opponent for granted.

"But stay ... (as Shakespeare might have put it)

ponder not on the morrow, but pay instant heed to the threat from the East/West." or as modern football speak might have it ... "We've got to take each game as it comes and this is the big one"

What all this amounts to is that we ought to be in for a thriller of a game tonight with each side doing its best to ensure that there will be no need

for a replay. Of course, the urgings of the managers before the game and at half-time can only be translated into results by the players on the field. And it is with regard to those endeavours that I should like to conclude this piece.

I have yet to meet a player who has not commented on the tremendous benefit there is in his team's

supporters getting behind them. It follows that we the fans have an extremely important part to play in encouraging our team. So come on lads, shout for your own side! Ritual chanting and gesturing at the supporters of the other side does absolutely nothing to encourage Your team. On the other hand, it does nothing but harm to the kind of sporting relationships we wrote about earlier. Welsh football needs every bit of positive support it can get. Get behind your team, and leave the other stuff where it belongs.

Cardiff City arrive at the Vetch Field tonight completing a unique sequence of games against the Swans. since the 1988/89 season both clubs have played each other in the League, L. Cup, F.A. Cup, Auto Glass Trophy and finally the Allbright Bitter Welsh Cup. Sitting just outside the play off positions. Cardiff have recently strengthened their side in a bid to achieve promotion this season. Financial Controller **Rick Wright** boldly announced at the start of the season a pay on performance policy with prices of admission related to position in the league. Also a £1m bonus policy would be paid out if the Bluebirds achieved promotion. Changes at Ninian Park has also a move to convert the Stadium into a 20,000 all seater arena by the end of the season. The enclosure in front of the Main Stand has already been converted to an all seater area.

'KEEPING POSITION

Gavin Ward has regained the goalkeeping position from experienced **Roger Hansbury**. The former Wolves and Shrewsbury reserve keeper has been in excellent form lately, but with the season entering a crucial time for the teams engaged in the promotion race, Cardiff will be glad to have the experienced **Roger Hansbury** to fall back on as cover. Defender **Mark Jones** will be missing from the line-up for the next 2 months with a bad injury suffered at Stoke in the Auto Glass Trophy Cup Tie, The Bluebirds have had their fair share of injuries this season. **Jason Perry**, **Neil Mathews**, **Gareth Abrahams** and **Paul Millar** have all missed matches through injury.

Gareth Abrahams in particular will be hoping to stay clear of injury and reclaim his First Team place. Youngster **Lee Baddeley** has made the centre half position his own this season with a series of consistent performances. Another youngster from the excellent youth policy the Bluebirds have created is **Andy Gorman**. He has come in for the injured **Mark Jones** and like **Lee Baddeley** will be striving for a permanent First Team place to the end of the season. Mountain Ash born **Allan Lewis** played against Stoke in the Auto Glass Cup Tie and he has occupied various defensive roles for the Bluebirds. A firm favourite with the Bluebirds' supporters is **Jason Perry**. He's currently been out of the First Team, but last season saw **Perry** make 43 league appearances. **John** has recently been signed on a permanent basis for £16,500 from Bournemouth. Having recently completed a month's loan at Ninian Park, **Williams** is likely to miss tonight's game because of cartilage trouble. Regular left back this season has been **Damon Searle**. He was brought into the First Team when the Bluebirds sold **Ray Daniel** to Portsmouth last season. Currently out through injury is former Blackpool defender **Neil Mathews**. He has also captained the N. Ireland U/21 side. Midfielder

Robin Semark has made the occasional appearance in midfield this season. Bury born youngster **Jamie Unsworth** appeared as one of the substitutes in the Stoke Cup Tie. He earned himself a contract after successfully completing his youth training. 37 year old captain **Roger Gibbins** has also been consistent performer since he started his second spell at Ninian Park. Last season 43 league appearances brought him 5 goals in either an attacking midfield role, or as a calming influence behind a young, inexperienced defence. **Pat Heard** made 38 league appearances last season and he played in the last away League game at Walsall.

TOP BUY

Paul Ramsay was a £100,000 buy from Leicester City at the start of the season. The Northern Ireland International has certainly made his presence felt this season in midfield. Formerly an apprentice with

Leicester, Derry born **Ramsay**, made 290 League appearances for Leicester, scoring 13 League goals. **Paul Millar** was also signed at the start of the season from Port Vale. Unfortunately, he has also missed a lot of games through injury. Another early season signing, **Carl Dale**, has forged an excellent partnership with **Chris Pike**. The former Bangor City and Chester striker has certainly proved to be a bargain buy at £95,000. **Chris Pike** meanwhile, will be hoping to get on the scoresheet again versus the Swans. Last season saw **Chris** top the scoring charts with 16 goals. He has an impressive goal scoring record since overcoming a serious back injury whilst with Fulham. Former Swans Trainee **Cameron Toshack** has still to establish himself in the first Team line-up, but he is likely to be one of the substitutes. Guyanan born **Cohen Griffiths** was a £60,000 buy from non-league Kettering in September 1989. Last season he scored 9 league goals from 43 league appearances. Two recent loan signings who will be in contention for places are **Eddie Newton** and **Gerry Harrison**. **Newton** is an attacking midfielder from Chelsea, whilst **Harrison** is a striker from Bristol City.

The Club was originally known as Riverside in 1899. Following the elevation of Cardiff City to city status in 1905, the club changed its name to "Cardiff City" in 1907. The present organisation was formed when they turned professional under the same name in 1910 and moved to their present Ninian Park ground which was built on the site of the Corporation's refuse tip. Cardiff joined the Southern League in which they played until 1920 when they were elected to the Football League's Second Division. F.A. Cup semi-finalists and promoted to Division One in 1921, they were First Division runners-up on goal average in 1924 in what remains the closest finish to a League Championship in the 100 years of the competition. They were F.A. Cup Finalists in 1925 losing to Sheffield United, and they were F.A. Cup winners in 1927,

Their history

beating Sheffield United, and they were F.A. Cup winners in 1927, beating Arsenal. Relegated in 1929, they went down from Division Two in 1931 and had to seek re-election to Division three (South) in 1934. Cardiff won the third Division (South) Championship on 1947, and were back in Division One by 1952, but they only remained until 1957. They regained a place in Division One in 1960 but were again relegated in 1962, and have yet to return to the top flight. In their place only to go down in 1982. Again they won immediate promotion, but they suffered two consecutive relegations (1985, 1986) to plunge to Division Four, from which they won promotion in the 1987/88 season as well as

winning the Welsh Cup for the twentieth time. Cardiff have also been runners-up in the trophy on eight occasions. fol-

lowing relegation to Division Four in 1989/90 they are hoping to return to Division Three at the second attempt.

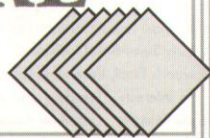
The Club hit the National news headlines as the start of this season when new financial controller Rick Wright announced a Three stage 'pay on performance' policy, with prices of admission related to the team's league position. He followed that up within 24 hours by announcing a one million pounds bonus pay out should the squad achieve promotion at the end of this term. With news also of the development of Ninian Park into a 20,000 all seater stadium by the turn of the year, this clearly is going to be an eventful season for the Bluebirds.

COLLECTING FOOTBALL PROGRAMMES

Once the collector has obtained at least one programme from each Football League club, he may wish to widen his one-per-club horizons to include clubs from other Leagues. Most football fans admit to an interest in a Scottish League or Irish League club, and a logical next step would be to obtain a copy of each club's programme from one or both of these Leagues. Nowadays, these are readily available with most good dealers carrying fairly substantial stocks, although the countries themselves have their own specialist dealers.

A word of caution to those wishing a one per club per season collection in Scotland or Ireland. It is only comparatively recently that all clubs have issued every season, indeed Ballymena United in the Irish League did not issue a single programme last season, although they have in the past. In Scotland, there have been some surprising omissions over the last 20 years, including a number of seasons in which Cowdenbeath, Montrose and Clydebank did not issue. Into the 60's and 70's, and there are more gaps, while programmes were often a rarity in the Scottish second Division in the 40's and 50's. One of the most fascinating tangents to explore in

programme collecting is that of Non-League programmes. Those from clubs in your vicinity are likely to be easiest to obtain, and it should be noted that many Non-League clubs have shops which boast programme stalls enthusiastically run which are a marvellous source of Non-League issues.

There are three main categories of Non-League collecting - one per club, which is an endless and enjoyable task as there are always new issues amongst the thousands of Non-League clubs, plus the expanding Sunday scene is now spawning programmes of a good quality. Secondly, there are

Non-League friendlies v League clubs, mostly pre-season games and not always against first elevens. Thirdly, there are the annual jousts between Non-League and League clubs in the first few rounds of the FA Cup.

Dealers make a point of obtaining this latter category, which produces a wide variety of fascinating programmes, often from unexpected Non-League qualifiers.

HAT-TRICKS AGAIN • David Farmer

The writer of this column is in discussions with our manager with regard to the possibility of us doing a regular piece on hat-tricks. Our first item in this series was published in the Chester City programme and, during that game, Jimmy Gilligan obliged by scoring three times. The second item was printed in the Birmingham City programme and, lo and behold, seven days later Steve Thornber added his name to the list of Swans League hat-tricksters.

Now, I have no doubt that my statistician friends will argue that these happenings are pure coincidence; quite frankly, in terms of logic I ought to agree with them. Yet... Yet... might there just be something in it? After all we don't know everything; and anyway it's worth a try. so, here we go again. If there are believers out there (and many footballers are superstitious to some degree, let alone us fans) keep your fingers crossed. Ladbrooks might give us generous odds, but occasionally even they fall flat on their faces. what is more, if it works, Frank burrows may be willing to sign the contract.

Readers of the last item may remember that we included a table which illustrated the number of hat-tricks which had been scored per season by

their frequency. It showed that, prior to this season, three hat-tricks had been scored during only four seasons, while four had been scored on five occasions. One question we might ask about this data is: Which trio of hat-tricks was scored over the shortest period of time: The point being that the present series has been grouped quite closely together.

As with all statistics, in trying to analyse the data involved, it is important to qualify it. In this case we should remember that most of the pre-war records were set during the period prior to the change in the offside law. Another factor is that some of the figures which follow are enhanced by the fact that two hat-tricks were scored in the same match. So, given those caveats, how does this season's record compare with the rest?

Well, the shortest time between the first and last of a trio being scored was 13 days (1927 - 28 season). The next best was 1924 - 25 with 15 days, with

1927 - 28 also providing the third best (The Swans scored four that season) with 24 days. Thereafter we come to the 1977 - 78 season when in the month of April, over 28 days, three hat-tricks (thus far) in the light of the fact that we did not score a single trio between the 4th September 1982 and Paul Chalmer's effort on 26th January 1990.

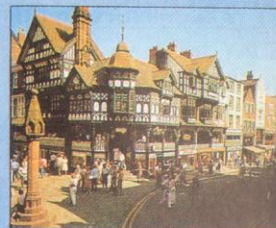
Oh, and a note for the players (in case they missed the implication of "thus far" above) there's quite a bit of the League programme still to play, so why not go for a record five hat-tricks... it has never been done before and it has to happen sometime, so why not enter your names into the record books?



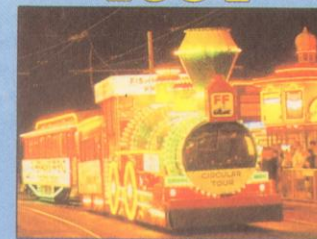
Steve Thornber proudly acknowledges the cheers after his hat-trick at West Bromwich Albion on 25/1/92

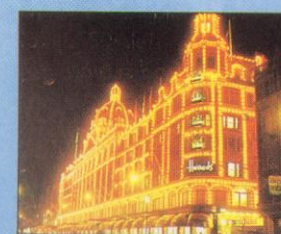

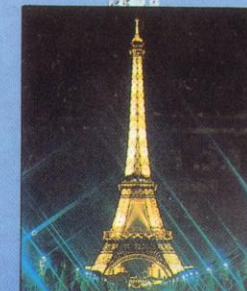
