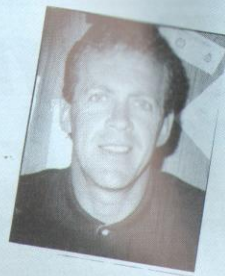

## Goalkeepers

**David Williams** was signed in the close season from Burnley on a free transfer, and has been the 'Bluebirds' first choice goalkeeper for all of this season. His last appearance for Burnley came in August 1992, and he made a total of 24 league appearances for the 'Clarets' plus 6 loan appearances for Rochdale prior to joining Cardiff last Summer. Aberystwyth born **Steve Williams** created a good impression last season at Ninian Park, his first season at the club following his release from Coventry City. He made his first team debut for Cardiff in last season's European Cup Winner Cup tie at Ninian Park against Standard Liege, and went on to make a total of 18 league appearances last season. A regular choice this season as substitute for Cardiff, **Steve** has recently been sidelined through injury. Former Merthyr and Barry Town goalkeeper **Steve Morris** has been added to the squad recently, and he has taken over the substitute goalkeeper role from **Steve Williams**. For the Hull City game in February, 18 year old **Patrick Mountain** was handed the substitute goalkeeper's jersey. He is a former Welsh Schoolboy and Youth International 'keeper.

## Defenders

Central defender **Jason Perry** made a welcome return to first team duty against Bournemouth after missing a number of games through injury and suspension. A hard uncompromising defender, **Jason** gained his first Welsh Cap in 1994 against Norway at Ninian Park, and since making his debut against Exeter City at Ninian Park in March 1987 has made over 225 league appearances for the

'Bluebirds'. His uncompromising style of play has unfortunately this season seen **Jason** receive the red card on 2 occasions against Stockport and Cambridge United. **Lee Baddeley** is another former trainee with Cardiff who has established himself as a regular choice this season in the defence. Last November against Brighton, **Lee** scored his first league goal, and prior to this season had made 38 league appearances for Cardiff. **Derek Brazil's** season has been affected by injuries, but when he has been available has played in either defence or midfield. An £85,000 signing from Manchester United in August 1992, the former Swans loan signing has been capped at B level for the Republic of Ireland, and also gained honours at U-23, 21 and Youth level. With first team chances limited at Old Trafford, **Derek** made 12 loan appearances for the Swans in 1991. Recently, **Derek** scored his first league goal for Cardiff against Huddersfield Town. Player/Coach **Mark Aizlewood** has also switched between defence and midfield this season as Cardiff have utilised his vast league and international experience. With over 520 league appearances gained from Newport County, Luton, Charlton, Leeds, Bradford, Bristol City and the 'Bluebirds', **Mark** was targeted by **Terry Yorath** during his second spell at the Vetch Field in 1990. A niggling hamstring injury has prevented **Mark** from claiming a regular place in this season's line-up, but he did add to his International appearances last year for Wales with an appearance against Bulgaria. **Damon Searle** has been a regular choice at left back for Cardiff since making his league debut at York in October 1990. Former Swans loan signing **Chris Honor** has recently been recalled by Scottish League Division 1 side Airdrie midway through his second month on loan at Ninian Park. He is a versatile player, who over the years has alternated between defence and midfield for Airdrie and his first club

Bristol City. Since joining Airdrie in August 1991, **Chris** has made 93 Scottish League appearances to add to his 60 league appearances made for Bristol City. Ironically, during his loan spell at the Vetch Field, **Chris** never made a home appearance, all his 4 appearances being away. **Andy Scott** has been recalled to the Cardiff first team recently, and has lined up alongside **Jason Perry** in the centre of defence. Signed on a free transfer from Premier League side Blackburn Rovers in the Summer, **Andy** had played all of his games for Cardiff this season at full back. thirty year old utility player **Wayne Fereday** joined Cardiff City last March from WBA on a free transfer. He is an experienced professional, having made 197 league appearances for his first club QPR. Further moves during his career took **Wayne** to Newcastle United, Bournemouth and WBA prior to joining Cardiff. An extremely quick winger, **Wayne** has been capped on 5 occasions for the Republic of Ireland U-21 side.

## Midfield

Goalscoring midfielder **Nick Richardson** has scored goals for 3 different clubs this season in the Second Division. Besides his 4 league goals for the 'Bluebirds', **Nicky** has scored once for Chester and twice for Wrexham during loan spells this season. A bargain signing from Halifax Town in August 1992, **Nicky** has recently made his 100th league appearance for Cardiff, **Nathan Wigg** made his Cardiff league debut in August 1993 against Brighton at Ninian Park, during his first season as a professional. A local product who has graduated through the club's youth set-up, **Nathan** is rated as a good passer of the ball by the club's coaching staff. In the league fixture at the Vetch recently, **Nathan** scored his only league goal to date. **Ryan Nicholls** has had some bad luck with injuries during his career, and he is currently on a non contract basis at Ninian Park.

# Cardiff City F.C. 94/5

Released by Leeds United last season, **Ryan** is hoping for a clean bill of health this season and earn himself a full contract with the 'Bluebirds'. The tenacious midfielder **Charlie Oatway** has been missing from the Bluebirds line-up since last February following a custodial sentence passed on him by Havering Magistrates Court after an incident in Romford last summer. Sent off on 2 occasions this season at Bradford and Cambridge, **Charlie** joined Cardiff in the close season from non-league Yeading FC of the Diadora League. Belfast born **Paul Miller** has alternated between midfield and attack since joining the Bluebirds from Port Vale in August 1991. A strong competitor with a fierce shot, the former N. Ireland Youth International has struggled with injuries this season, and to date is second top goalscorer with 6 league goals. During his time with Irish League side Portadown, **Paul** was voted Ireland's Young Player of the Year for 1986.

## Strikers

**Cohen Griffiths** joined Cardiff City in October 1989 from non-league Kettering Town for a fee in the region of £70,000. Prior to the start of this season he had made a total of 196 league appearances for Cardiff and scored 35 goals. Signed initially as a winger, **Cohen** has also played in midfield for the Bluebirds during his 6 seasons at Ninian Park. **Carl Dale** returned to first team action recently against his old club Chester City after a spell out with knee ligament problems and scored the first goal in a 2-1 victory for Cardiff. Signed in 1991 for £95,000, **Carl** has proved to be a bargain signing, and is currently top goalscorer at Ninian Park with 7 league goals this season, despite missing most of the season through injuries. At Chester his consistent goalscoring warranted him a place in the Welsh International squad to face West Germany in a World Cup game. Prior to joining Chester in 1988, **Carl** had been a successful goalscorer

at non-league level for Rhyl and Bangor, **Anthony Bird** made a welcome return to first team duty recently against Chester, and in the following game with Leyton Orient scored 2 match winning goals. A product of the club's Youth Training Scheme, **Anthony** has been capped at U-18, Youth and U-21 level for Wales and is rated a fine prospect for the future. Last season during his first season as a professional, **Anthony** scored 5 league goals from 35 league appearances. **Darren Adams** scored a sensational debut goal last season against Wrexham at Ninian Park following his elevation from non-league football. He has since unfortunately failed to add any further goals to his tally, and this season has struggled to cope with the demands of full time football,

remaining on the fringes of the first team squad at Ninian Park. Experienced striker **John Pearson** was signed on a non-contract basis last January and is still waiting for his first Cardiff goal. Strong in the air, and a good leader of the forward line, **John** had started his career as an apprentice with Sheffield Wednesday and made a total of 105 league appearances for their first team, scoring 24 goals. Further moves in his career took him to Charlton, Leeds, Barnsley and Carlisle, from where he was released earlier this season. 17 year old **Lee Vick** from Barry was given his first team opportunity last month after only the one reserve team outing. A first year YTS trainee, **Lee** possesses a long throw in, and is rated an excellent crosser of the ball.

# Looking Back

## Off! But Ante's Tackle wins cup

ANTE RAJKOVIC GOES BACK to Yugoslavia next week with his first tangible evidence of the success which Swansea City have been enjoying for the past four years. But the defender regarded by many as the most effective performer in the First Division goes home with his Welsh Cup-winning tankard in the knowledge that he will almost certainly miss the start of next season.

That's the price Rajkovic is likely to have to pay for being sent off in the second leg of the final against Cardiff, which Swansea's 10 men hung on to win 2-1.

Rajkovic paid the ultimate penalty in the 68th minute of a fiercely competitive final, the best for many years, for an offence which ironically ensured another season of European football for the club he joined from Sarajevo 15 months ago.

And when Swansea's name goes into the hat for the Cup Winners Cup draw in July, the club will need no reminding of the contribution made by their impressive sweeper.

### RELIEVED

Swansea may choose to remember his first season for rather different reasons, but even relieved manager John Toshack was forced to concede: "Rajkovic won the cup with that tackle".

It came 22 minutes from the end of a finely balanced contest, in which Third Division bound Cardiff always seemed determined to finish the job they had started in the first leg.

Swansea, forced to come from behind to establish a winning platform, had already lost Gary Stanley with a knee injury which could require surgery during the close season.

Swansea re-grouped with striker Ian Walsh, on as a replacement between Bob Latchford's two match winning goals, and by the end of a hectic opening half Rajkovic had been shown the yellow card for a foul on full-back Mick Henderson.

It seemed a rather harsh decision on Swansea's acting captain, especially as Anglesey referee Gwyn Owen had allowed several more blatant offences to go unpunished.

But when a second, more deliberate act was committed on Phil Lythgoe with Swansea's defence wide open. Mr. Owen, handling his last match before retirement, had little option but to send Rajkovic off.

### TRIPPED

Rajkovic tripped the player as he raced through unchallenged, a professional foul in most eyes but still regarded as a justifiable action in such circumstances.

Certainly, had Lythgoe got away from first Neil Robinson and then Rajkovic, and in all probability equalised, Cardiff would have gone through had the scores remained level.

The absence of the accomplished Rajkovic, already suspended once this season, left Swansea to negotiate a nervous final 20 minutes.

Despite a certain amount of nail-biting, Swansea need not have worried, particularly with players of the calibre of Robbie James around.

James, voted the club's player of the year last weekend, was the outstanding performer on a night which again underlined the need for Welsh clubs, not those from across the border, to compete for the country's premier trophy.

### ENJOYED

James, top scorer again this season, started the match in

midfield, prompting many moves with his subtle touches, before dropping back to take over from his captain.

"I've never played at the back before, but I really enjoyed it. I wasn't really worried," he confessed.

Neither, it seemed was Toshack: "Magnificent, there's nothing in the game he cannot do," declared the manager.

Swansea were also indebted to solid supporting roles from the experienced Ray Kennedy, Dzemail Hadziabdic and goal-scoring hero Latchford.

The big striker scored twice in 11 minutes after Gary Bennett had caught the Swansea defence cold with a goal after just three minutes.

Newcomer Stan McEwan combined with overlapping full-back Linden Jones, and after Rajkovic's attempted clearance Bennett chested the ball over the line.

James and the recalled Alan Curtis helped to create the first of Latchford's goals, and Hadziabdic set up the second with a perfectly weighted through ball which allowed the Swansea striker to volley home from 15 yards.

Latchford was also responsible for securing his side's interval lead, scooping a Gary Bennett header off the line after a mistake by goalkeeper Dai Davies.

But the fast-moving action was centred almost entirely in the Swansea penalty area in the last 15 minutes, with the best chance falling to Dave Bennett, who failed to get any power behind a header which Davies saw late. Swansea survived, and when Rajkovic walked back on to the pitch to receive the trophy, no-one was in any doubt over how much Swansea owed to Messrs. Rajkovic, James and Latchford.

## DAVID HEALEY

Any footballer will tell you that the quality of the surface on which he plays can affect his performance. Consequently, the condition of the pitch here at the Vetch is of concern to all our players. Fortunately in David Healey, we have a man whose professional care of the turf which makes up the Vetch surface, reflects his dedication.

David, who is married to a former Miss Wales, took over from another dedicated carer of turf, Harold Woolcott, as he said, - a hard act to follow, and he has been on the Vetch staff for five years now, the last two of which have seen him take on the role of Stadium Manager. Not surprisingly the care of the Vetch turf remains a special interest of David's though, typical of the man, he brings a professional approach to all he does.

A Morriston boy, David Healey played rugby as a teenager and captained Clase School and Penlan School sides from the first

year through to the fourth. He was, also, captain of Swansea Schoolboys, directing things from the outside half position. He had dreams of the Welsh No 10 jersey but, unfortunately he had a serious knee injury which meant he had to 'hang up his boots' at an early age.

Wanting to keep in touch with sport, David started his career in groundsmanship with Swansea City Council and worked with them for ten years, the last five of which were spent at Morfa Stadium. David's practical skill was augmented by attending Pencoed College where he studied Turf culture and gained National Certificates in the process.

Last season, in particular, the turf at the Vetch at the end of the season was, when compared with that at some far bigger club, in excellent condition. This year, despite the dreadful weather we have had, the gallons of rain which have been poured onto the pitch, it is still in a remarkably



good condition. All in all, it is a testimony to the dedication of David Healey and his team. Another fine professional on our staff.

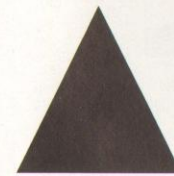
