➔ Former Swansea City goalkeeper Willy Gueret will make his return to the Liberty Stadium tonight determined to shut out his old side and edge closer to his clean sheet target for the season.

Having made the free transfer to stadiummk in the summer, the French shot-stopper has been in great form for the League Two leaders after a difficult start that saw him concede eight goals in his first four games.

But big Willy bounced back in style and has almost reached his clean sheet target for the season with three months to spare.

The 35-year-old vowed to Dons manager Paul Ince that he would achieve at least 20 shut-outs this season.

And he has already secured 16 clean sheets so far this seson for the Dons.

"I said to the gaffer I want 20 clean sheets," he said. "I am not that far away from that now and I just want it as quickly as possible.

"I think clean sheets will be the

key this season, and if we keep on getting them, then we can get promotion.

"We do need to start winning more at home, because our form at home is not the best considering where we are in the table.

"If you want to get promotion you should be winning your home games, but it's not that easy. I think if we start to win our home games we will be fine. If not we'll have to keep on picking up results away.

"But it's hard to play at home

"But it's hard to play at home because they all just sit there and are hard to break down. But we are working hard on it and I believe we've got enough quality in the squad to get promotion and win the title."

Having achieved promotion from League Two with the Swans under

former manager Kenny Jackett, it would be an impressive double for a goalkeeper who has matured and improved with age.

Born in Saint Claude, Guadeloupe, in 1973, Willy's career started with Le Mans in France where he played with a young Didier Drogba.

He moved to these shores on a free transfer to join Millwall in 2000. After four years at the New Den where he never really had the chance to shine, Gueret joined

the Swans and quickly installed himself as the number one.

He went on to make 132 league appearances for the Swans before joining the Dons in the summer of 2007 on a free-transfer.

Regarded as an athletic shot stopper with a great presence

behind the back four, he has played a key role for the Dons this season after the League Two club eventually got their man after the Swans turned down an initial bid of £100,000 for his services a year earlier.

Although Gueret didn't have the best of starts with the Dons, he believes the decision to replace goalkeeping coach Ademole Bankole with Paul Heald has benefited him greatly.

Gueret claimed it was the right decision as he felt Heald – in his second spell as goalkeeping coach after he was made chief scout and then assistant academy director – is a better coach.

"With all due respect to George, Paul knows more about football and the goalkeeper position, so that has helped me a lot – he talks sense.

"I don't like people always on my back telling me things and he understands that. He lets me play my games then after the games he tells me what he thought about it.

"I've got a good relationship with him and I've got a lot of respect for him, so it's great. It's a different way to think about and approach the games.

"It's a sharpness thing – his training is short and sharp and he works me hard. I want to work hard every week so I'm ready for the games.

"As a goalkeeper you need

to feel ready for the games, so we're working hard and it has paid off."

And despite entering the twilight of his career at 35, Gueret insists he still has plenty of fuel in the tank to play until he's 40 – injuries permitting of course.

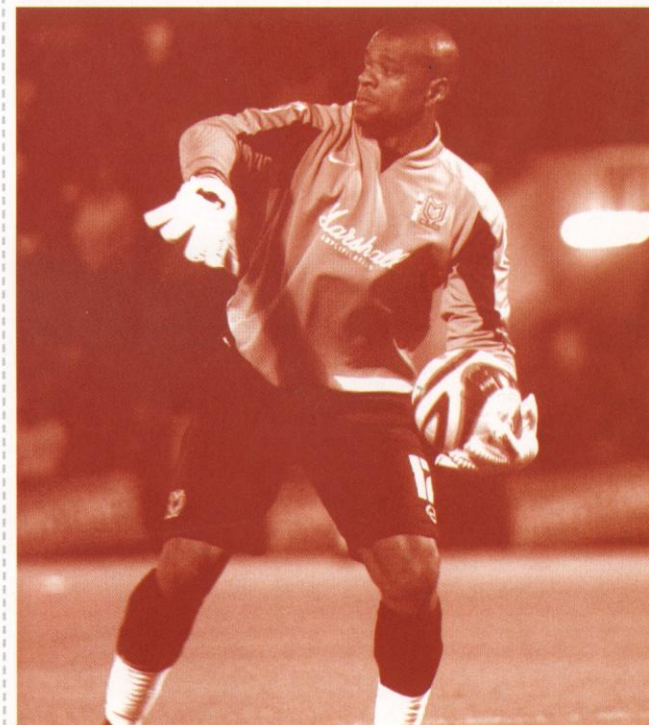
"Hopefully I will be in the business for the next five or six years," he added. "The goalkeeper position is a different position, so if I can keep myself fit and nothing happens to me I will go as long as I can."

"With Nathan Abbey breathing down my neck, I have to work hard to keep myself fit and keep my place."

Gueret has a good relationship with Ince, revealing another challenge he's got going with the ever competitive Guv'nor.

"We have got a bet that he thinks he's going to score 10 goals against me in training this season.

"We've got a bit of money on it too. He still has a bit of quality on the pitch, but hopefully I can win."

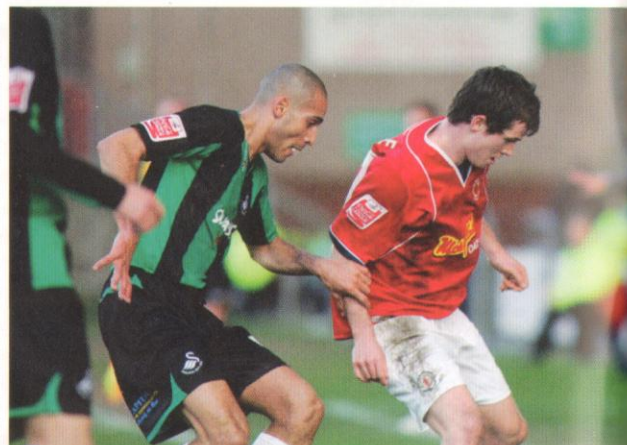

"The fact that we were so much in control probably cost us dearly. It made us do some very uncharacteristic things. If you play like that nine times out of 10 you will win, but today we learned about the harsh realities of football in this league. The easiest thing in football is to deal with long balls, but for some reason we were not able to do it at the end. We have no one to blame but ourselves and we have to make sure that we don't allow it to happen again in the future."

"It was hard work and they flew at them right from the start. The attitude was excellent, Swansea are a good team and good players so it was always going to be difficult - and it was. 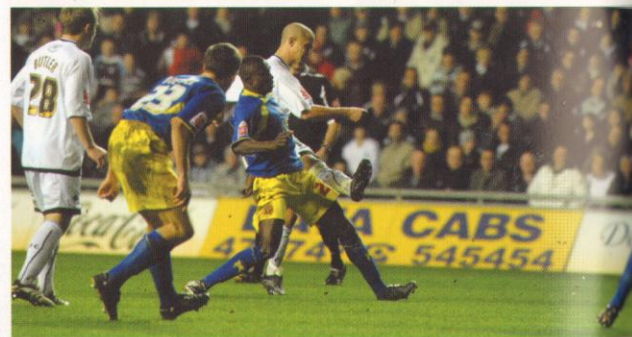

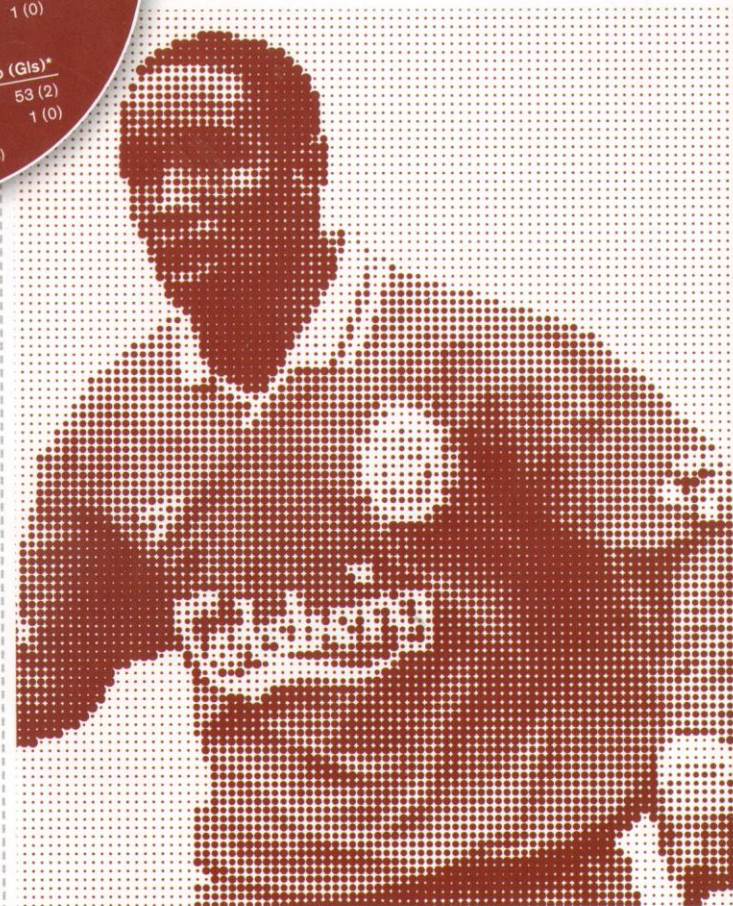
➔ Paul joined the club in June last year after a very successful eight months in charge of Macclesfield Town. Having inherited a side rock bottom of League Two in October 2006, 39-year-old Ince masterminded the Silkmen's recovery that saw them secure their Football League status on the final day of the season. Six wins and a draw in December 2006 saw Ince pick up the Manager of the Month award and went a long way to ensuring Macc's safety.

A quite remarkable playing career saw Ince win every domestic honour; a European Cup Winners' Cup and collect 55 England caps – becoming his country's first black captain in the process.

He joined Manchester United from West Ham in 1989, going on to win two League titles with the Red Devils before becoming one of the few Englishmen to conquer foreign shores. He joined Italian side Internazionale for £8 million in 1995 and became a San Siro favourite with his hard midfield play, lung-busting running and effective passing game.

He returned to England two seasons later and went on to play for Liverpool, Middlesbrough, Wolves, Swindon and even put in a final-day appearance for Macclesfield last season.

Nathan Abbey

Islington-born and Bedford-based, Nathan joined the club in the summer after spending much of pre-season on trial with the club. After starting out as a trainee at Luton, Abbey spent time with a variety of clubs including Northampton and Stevenage before settling at Boston. He played 73 games for the Pilgrims before moving to Bristol City and then Torquay. He made 40 League appearances last season during spells with the Torquay and Brentford before making the switch to MK. He was the hero of the Dons Carling Cup win over Ipswich, this season, saving Dan Harding's penalty in the shootout.

Keith Andrews

Keith joined the Dons on a free transfer from Championship club Hull City in the summer of 2006, having spent the previous season at the KC Stadium. During his time with the Tigers, he had captained the side on numerous occasions, playing a total of 30 matches. He is

a tough and determined central midfielder, who can also play and has a keen eye for a pass. He has a superb engine, making lung-busting runs from start to finish and shoots with great power from distance. Keith was handed the captain's armband last season. Born in Dublin in 1980, his first club in England was Wolves, where he joined the Youth team at the same time as Tottenham striker Robbie Keane. During his time at Molineux, Keith appeared in the Premiership and enjoyed loan spells at Walsall, Stoke and Oxford.

Sam Baldock

Sam will go down in history as the first Milton Keynes native to sign for the club after the relocation. Having scored bagfuls of goals at every level of the Academy set up and the reserves, the striker made headlines when he scored four times in an FA Youth Cup game at the tender age of 16. Now 18, Sam will be looking to build on the Football League debut he made against Mansfield in March.

Drew Broughton

After playing in the Milton Keynes youth leagues as a child, Drew started his career at Norwich after being spotted playing for local boys' team Woburn Lions. Now 28, the big striker has developed a reputation as a no-nonsense target man who never gives defenders a moment's piece. His career to date has seen him enjoy spells with, among others, Peterborough, Kidderminster, Rushden and Boston. Drew is currently on loan to Wrexham until February 23.

Colin Cameron

Paul Ince was quick to sign the experienced Scotland international upon his arrival in the summer. Cameron trained with the club at the start of pre-season before signing a one-year deal on August 1, 2007. A midfielder of Premiership pedigree, Cameron has built a reputation as an energetic midfielder, a great link-up man and a scorer of important goals. Having started his career north of the border with Raith,

he moved to Hearts where he caught the eye with 48 goals from 154 league games from midfield. A move to England beckoned and Wolves forked out £1.75m to make it happen. Cameron went on to win promotion to the Premiership with Wolves, in a spell that first saw him hook up with Ince as a player. Spells at Millwall and Coventry followed before he left the Ricoh Arena at the end of last season.

Mustapha Carayol

Young Muss joined the club with Paul Ince in the summer of 2007 and, after impressing on trial, signed a two-year contract before the start of the season. The Gambia-born winger has already had spells with Swindon and Macclesfield and looks set for big things with the Dons. Blessed with

exceptional pace, a bag of tricks and a keen eye for goal, he is a young player with a big future.

Sam Collins

Sam, 18, is a promising young full-back with a jack-hammer left foot and a product of the club's Academy. Having impressed for the Under 18s and the reserves last season, he was rewarded with a place on the bench for the League Two fixture at home to Wrexham, and a professional contract at the end of it. A player with pace, strength and an eye for goal more associated with a left winger, Collins is a player to watch for the future.

Drissa Diallo

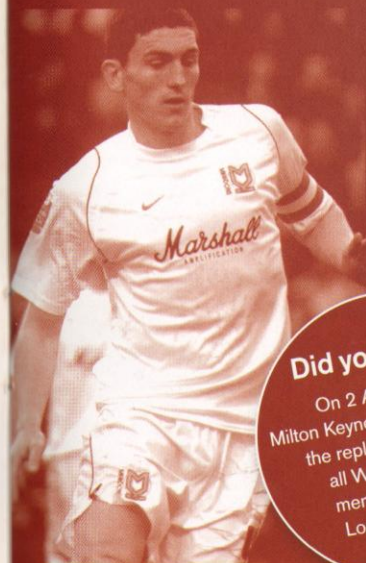
The Guinean international came to England in January 2003,

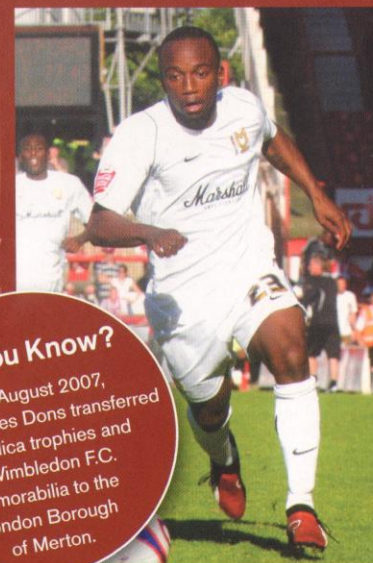
Craig Dobson

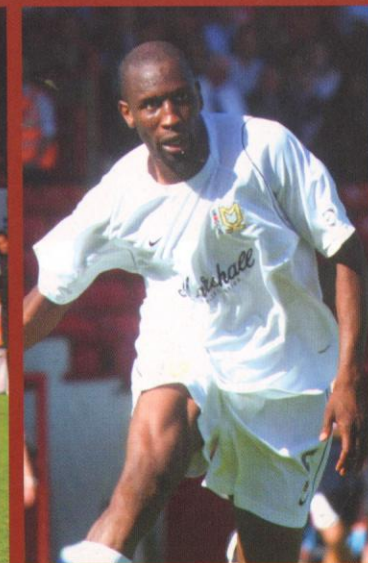

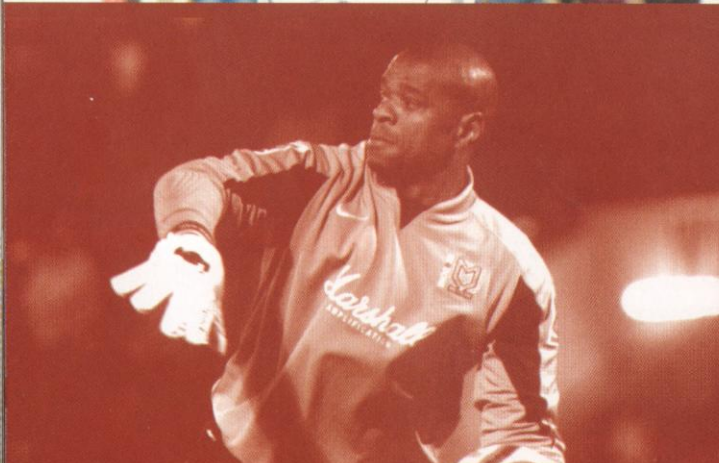

A proper old-fashioned left winger, Lloyd was born in Birmingham in 1982 and began his career as a trainee with West Brom. Although limited to cameo substitute appearances at the Hawthorns, Lloyd became a favourite with the fans and played an important role in helping the Baggies reach the Premiership. He is an exciting and

pacy player who made an instant impression on the Dons faithful with two goals against Brighton while on trial, leading to the club offering him a two-year contract.

Liam Kelly

One of the many bright stars being guided through the Dons Academy. He is a direct midfield player with good touch and the ability to strike the ball accurately from range. His versatility, which enables him to play right across midfield or fill in at right-back will give him every chance to success in the future. In 2007 he was named Most Improved Academy Player of the Year.

Dean Lewington

Having graduated through the Academy, Dean is a genuine favourite with Dons supporters and continues to earn admirers with his committed displays. He is a hard-working left back, who was born in Kingston, Surrey. His father, Ray, is reserve team coach for Premiership club Fulham having been a player Chelsea, Fulham, Brighton and Sheffield United as well as being manager of Fulham, Brentford and most recently Watford. 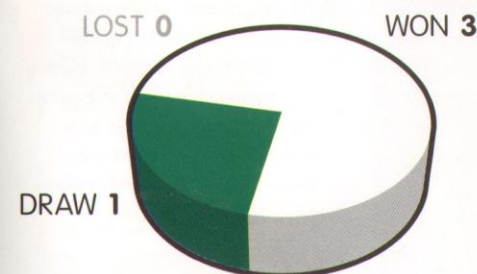

Kieran Murphy

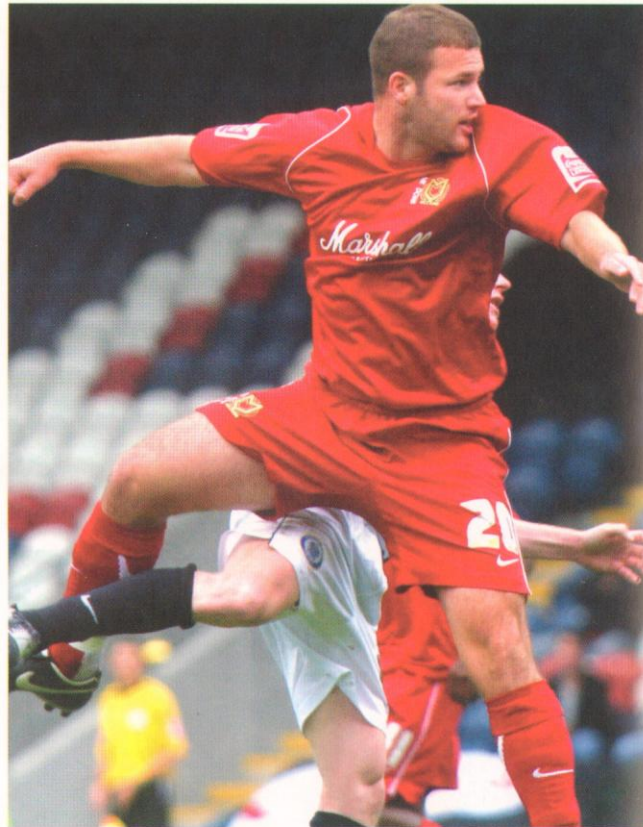

Having graduated through the Bescot Academy, Wright made 141 appearances for the Saddlers since making his debut for the club in 2000. 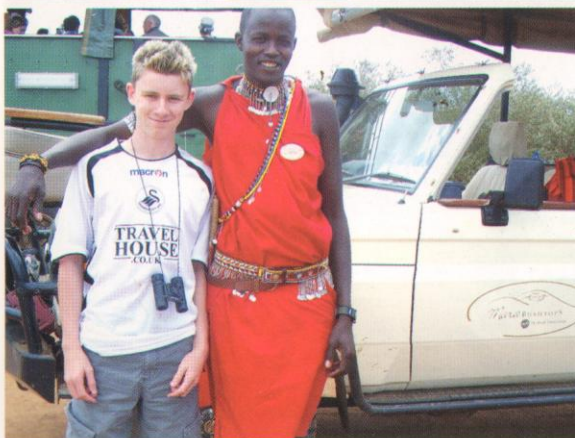

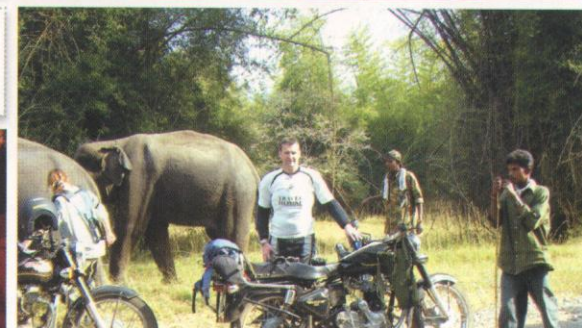

What's it like

Up to 3,000 away fans can get into the North Stand. Being a brand new stadium, facilities are top notch; expect great views and the amount of leg room you get at the Liberty. With work still to be done to the stadium, it looks like it hasn't quite been finished yet.

Food on offer includes cheeseburgers, hotdogs, a few varieties of pies, pasties, sausage rolls, pizza pods and spicy potato wedges.

The down-side is it's in the middle of nowhere. It's miles away from the centre of Milton Keynes, so not many pubs or food outlets near, other than the café in Asda (MK1 1SA) next door. It has a cash machine and petrol station, so worth filling up on cheap fuel for the journey home.

The famous Milton Keynes concrete cows have been immortalised in the mascot, a cow called Mooie, the South Stand is called the 'cowshed' and the locals have nicknamed the ground 'The Moo Camp'.

The stadium also has electronic turnstiles, Cost of ticket: £10 for adults, £5 for concessions, and £1 for under 16's.



What the Dons Fans Think

Colin Berry says: "The best thing about the club is Willy Gueret; the worst thing is the people booing after a loss even though your team are top! Prediction is 1-1 at Swansea, 2-1 to Dons at MK. We'll finish second in the league and if we get through, of course we'll win the final".

Chris Read says: "Best thing is our fantastic new stadium (The Moocamp) and the management team Winkleman has employed. Worst thing is the lack of atmosphere from two of the three home stands. Prediction is Swans 1 Dons 0 at Swansea. In MK, Dons 2 Swans 1; Dons to do it on pens!"

Tony Hawkins says: "The best thing is the club is genuinely family friendly with a great community spirit. The worst thing is the poor atmosphere at home games when the fans are spread around so much. Prediction is 0-0 at Swansea, 2-1 at home and we'll win the final. We'll finish in the top three, that's all I'm saying!"

Oliver Platt reckons: "The best thing is the great football in a fantastic stadium with a friendly atmosphere. The worst thing is the amount of Arsenal/Man U/Chelsea shirts, and the amount of people leaving early when things are going badly - we have some great fans, especially away, but also some moaners. Prediction is if we can nick a draw in Wales, we might just be able to sneak it, but I'm expecting something like 2-1 Swansea and a 1-1 draw."

Steve Gifford says: "The best thing about the club is having an energetic, enthusiastic chairman who knows how to build for the future. The worst thing is the amount of hatred there is for this club from other fans due to our existence. What's done is done, so let's move on."

Rodge the Dodge says: "The best thing is our fantastic new stadium (albeit not completed!) and the brilliant fans in the Cowshed that are real life 'Band of Brothers' - and sisters' too! The worst thing is the franchise stigma that some fans still like to throw at us, but the

vast majority I have met are fine when you meet them in person! I think we will get beat at the Liberty Stadium but could turn it around at ours and hopefully a nice trip to Wembley, with us winning the final."

Tommy Lala reckons "The best thing is our growing fan base from Premier clubs. The worst thing is giving Merton Council OUR trophies! Prediction for both games. 1-1 away and 2-1 home win Dons."

Pubs and Grub

Alcohol is not sold at evening games because of their licence. The nearest pub is 'The Beacon' (MK1 1PA) - a 10 minute walk in the nearby Mount Farm area on an industrial estate behind the ground. It's a 25 minute walk into Bletchley, where there are a few pubs. The first that you will come to is the 'Enigma Tavern' (MK2 2EN). Fenny Stratford is a village a mile away and has a number of pubs close together, one of which is the 'Foundry Arms' (MK2 2NQ) with a fish and chip shop nearby. In Milton Keynes, there are a few pubs near the main shopping centre, and close to the train station. Coming out of the station you go straight up Midsummer Boulevard in front of you. After a five minute walk you'll find 'Wetherspoons' (MK9 1EA). Further up the road are other Wetherspoon pubs, the 'Secklow Hundred', 'The Moon Under Water' and Lloyds No.1 Bar' (MK9 3PU).

Directions, Parking & Train

Milton Keynes is easy to get to if you're close to the M1. Coming from South Wales, it's a nightmare cross-country trip. I've been to Milton Keynes a few times and the grid system is hard to navigate with roundabout after roundabout after roundabout. Easy for the locals because they've got used to it, but for a one-off visit it's a nightmare. If you have sat nav use it, or if you know someone with sat nav, borrow it, you'll have problems without it. From J15 of the M4, go across country through Oxford. Then follow signs for Northampton then Aylesbury, then Milton Keynes. If from the south, leave the M1 at J14 and head towards Milton Keynes. From the north, leave the M1 at J15 go onto the A508 towards Stony Stratford, follow

this road for 14 miles, to join the A5. After a few miles follow AA road-signs for stadium:mk. There are 2,000 car parking spaces at the stadium (£5). Otherwise you can park in the Denbigh West industrial estate. **By Train:** Nearest station is Bletchley, two miles away served by trains from Euston & Birmingham New Street. There's a taxi rank outside or a 25 minute walk. Turn LEFT out of the station and go down the steps, turn LEFT under the railway bridge. At the roundabout by the 'Park' pub turn LEFT. Keep straight on, and you'll finally see the stadium. The MK Metro routes 15 & 16 go to Asda next to the ground every half hour. Bus stop is on the main road (Sherwood Drive) running past the station.

➡ Luton Town boss Mick Harford was forced to defend his position as manager after seeing his side crash to a lacklustre 4-1 defeat at home to fellow strugglers AFC Bournemouth last week.

The Luton boss was hugely disappointed by his team's performance, but despite the fact that the Hatters are still struggling in the relegation zone, he believes he can bring success to Kenilworth Road in the long term.

He said: "I believe I'm the right man to turn this club round. It's a long term job. It's a challenge I look forward to.

"It's a long hard road. It's difficult times for us. We are not the biggest back fours, we don't have a commanding centre half who can head the ball. In fact, we are not blessed with defenders or centre halves.

"There's an imbalance in the squad. We are over-loaded with strikers.

"Against Bournemouth it is the first time I have ever seen a team go into a professional game with

no central defenders on the pitch.

"We've asked the Football League for help, but they don't seem interested. We're in a deep, dark tunnel, but there is a light at the end of that tunnel."

Harford hopes the troubled League One club can come out of administration "in the next three weeks".

Luton have entered administration in November and named the LTF2020 group as a preferred bidder last month.

The group have put substantial funds into the club over the last few weeks - ensuring that no further players had to be sold after Dave Edwards and Chris Coyne left at the start of January - and Harford hopes to tie up the sale of the club soon.

He said: "2020 have put a large amount of money in. Hopefully in the near future we will be looking to come out of administration. That's the plan in the next three weeks.

"If we stick together and have the unity between the players and staff, we can get out of trouble.

"This club has got a bright future and the people coming in will help turn it around. It's going to be a rollercoaster."

Former Luton midfielder David Edwards also wished the Hatters luck as they bid to escape the "nightmare" of their current crisis.

The 22-year-old made a £600,000 move to Wolves last month after playing a major part in Luton's remarkable 1-1 FA Cup draw with Liverpool and admits that life at Kenilworth Road was difficult.

He said: "It was very difficult at Luton in the end, the lads really stuck together but in the time I was there I got two weeks wages out of 10 and that was not good.

"It was Christmas time, and did not affect me being a young lad as it did some of the other guys with families.

"It's a lovely club and I enjoyed my time there. I have great sympathy for the players and the fans. The former manager Kevin Blackwell was always brilliant with me and I wish them all well in the future."
