- (5) Did you progress straight into the first team? Yes, that's why Harry Gregg signed me.
- (6) What can you remember about your debut? I had a nightmare, lost 3-1 away to Doncaster Rovers. Malcolm Struel Chairman said, "What have we signed here?"
- (7) What was playing at the Vetch like?
- (8) What was the crowd at Swansea like?
 Enjoyed the ground and the crowd who were very good to me. I became a local hero to them. The Vetch was small compared to what I was used to but it brought me closer to the supporters.
- (9) Did you have much contact with the fans, apart from playing in front of them? Yes, I used to go to the local clubs with Harry Griffiths to do presentations and met many of the fans. We got on together very well.

 Arsenal made an offer for me (£70,000) which Swansea could not refuse and as a pro I had to go even though I didn't want to.
