This evening we welcome a group of soccer giants who have placed the town of Swansea high on the world's sporting scene. Men of pride and character. Professionals in every sense of the word but modest in their demeanour.

We salute these artists and think back to the days when most were household names throughout the length and breadth of Britain.

The match is unique. Never before has a town been able to group its sons for such a sporting occasion. Between them hundreds of Welsh international caps have been won - thousands upon thousands of football fans have applauded their skill and eniciency and although some of the players are approaching the more gentler years of middle age, they will never be forgotten.

Swansea, with a population of less than 200,000, has no equal anywhere where soccer is played. Since the end of the second World War, no season has passed without at least one Swansea born footballer being involved in international conflict.

The 5 goals scored by Jack Fowler in the 6-1 defeat of Charlton is still the best individual scoring record for the League team.

The Reserves record is Peter Leyland's 7 goals in the 10-1 defeat of Porth in the Welsh League.

Swans who made over 300 League appearances for the club are Joe Sykes, Jim Collins, Harry Deacon, Billy Hole, John King, Sid Lawrence and Ivor Allchurch.

The Swans best home wins were the 8-1 defeats of Bristol Rovers & Bradford City.

Swans biggest home defeats were 1-6 by Bradford and the same by Workington.

Present 'All Whites' full back S. Ferguson's father kept goal for Swansea Town for many years and was affectionately known as "Fergy".

Stan Cullis played his last League game on the Vetch Field and during the match retired due to injury.

Ralph Wishart "Ralph's Book Shop" father was trainer to the promotion side 1926.

BRIEF HISTORY OF SWANSEA TOWN A.F.C.

Part-time professional soccer existed in the mining valleys of Glamorgan many years before it was sparked off as big business in Merthyr in 1908 and at Cardiff in 1910.

The Swansea Town Club was conceived in 1911, and came to life the following year. Soccer, however, had been played in haphazard fashion in the district for some years previously. The teachers fostered it in the elementary schools during the 'eighties', and later those ex-schoolboys could be said to have originated the Swansea District League in the early 'nineties', which comprised clubs from the Port Talbot and Ammanford districts. At the same time, an amateur club know as Swansea Town, was created and represented the town in the Welsh Club Competition.

It was during this period that the first Schools League was formed, under the supervision of the teachers, and this did more than anything else to establish the soccer code in Swansea.

So great had the interest in the game grown in the early years of the century that the success of the clubs at Merthyr and Cardiff gave an impetus to the idea of forming a town club in Swansea. In 1911, a few local soccer enthusiasts, with the help of the Swansea League officials, decided to create a town club. Their biggest obstacle was the ground difficulty; the only possible sites were in S'tetty and Morriston. In 1912 they heard that the Vetch Field was likely to be available. This waste patch, used as a playing field by some local clubs, was needed by the Gas Co., to extend their works, but following vehement protests by the tenants of houses in the vicinity, Parliament refused the Gas Co.'s request.

This was a bit of luck for the Soccer pioneers, who promptly stepped in and rented the ground as a home for the Swans.

The pioneers of this soccer movement were Messrs. J. W. Thorpe (Magistrate's Clerk), S. B. Williams, Chas. Jenkins and E. Sambrook, and little did they, or the sceptics in the local rugby world, dream that ten years later they would see 15,000 spectators queuing to get into the Vetch Field on Saturday afternoons.

The Swans first board of directors were Messrs. J. W. Thorpe (Chairman), P. Molyneux, F. Newcombe, D. J. Bassett, T. Martin, J. Hopkins and H. Behenna, with S. B. Williams as Secretary. They engaged ex-Derby goalkeeper W. Whittaker as player manager, and he gathered together a team of professionals of such quality that the Swans won the Welsh Cup and the Welsh League in the

first year of their existance, and in addition earned nation-wide acclaim for the high quality of their football. Two members of that original team are still resident in Swansea at the time this was written, viz. Jim Swarbrick and Jock Weir.

The Swans have been well served by directors deeply interested in the progress of soccer in the town. Outstancing among them have been J. W. Thorpe Owen Evans, Watts Jones and Abe Freedman, who received invaluable assistance from that paragon of club officials, the unflappable S. B. Williams who controlled the destinies of the club for over 30 years.

One of the Swans many achievements was to become the first South Wales club to reach the first round of the F.A. Cup; that was in 1913-14. Another feat was in 1914-15, when they startled the football world by defeating Blackburn Rovers in a Cup-tie at the Vetch Field by 1-0, the goal scorer being that well known character in both soccer and rugby, Ben Beynon.

The Swans most successful seasons were 1923-24-25, when Joe Sykes captained what was probably the best team that has ever worn the Swans colours. In successive years they won promotion to the Second League and for the first time in their history reached the semi-final of the F.A. Cup.

Throughout the history of soccer, it has been an accepted fact that the backbone of a successful team is a strong half-back line, and the Swans have provided a few examples of the truth of this conviction. Old timers can never forget the superb play of Collins, Sykes and Macpherson in those successful years of the 'Twenties', which in later years was almost duplicated, first by Warner, Hanford and Lloyd, and later by Paul, Weston and Burns. It is a regrettable fact that the Vetch Field has not for some years seen the equals of those half-backs for all-round ability. The present day value in transfer fees of any of the trios mentioned would be staggering.

Most were 'imported' players from England and Scotland, but Ireland also made it's contribution in such polished artists as Feeney, Keane, M'Grory. O'Driscoll and Lockhart.

Other players who added lustre to the game at the Vetch Field were Wilf Milne, whose nearly 600 League appearances has been challenged only by the 400 appearances made by Harry Griffiths. Jack Fowler whose 5 goals in the 6-1 defeat of Charlton remains the best individual scoring record for the League team, whilst Peter Leylands 7 goals in the 10-1 defeat of Porth in a Welsh League game holds first place in Reserve team scoring records. An odd coincidence is that probably the best ball-playing inside forwards to wear the Swans colours all were named Ivor, viz. Brain, Jones and Allchurch.

No look back over the Swans history can be made without recognition of the great part played by Swansea school teachers in fostering the game in the district. They planted the soccer seed in the schools and tended it whilstit germinated into local League and thence into the professional stage of the game, and thus became a consistent source of supply not only to the Swans but to Wales also, for since Billy Hole was given international honours in 1922, Swansea exschoolboys have collected more than 300 senior Welsh caps between them, whilst their reputations have been so high throughout the country that the aggregate amount in transfer fees paid for their services is nearly half a million pounds. Can any other town in the British Isles of Swansea's size equal such a distinction?

THE VISITORS

What can we say of the Stars who have promised to visit the Vetch tonight? Who better to organise such a club than **JIMMY HILL**. As a player he was a Fulham stalwart for many seasons. Although full International honours evaded him he played for England "B" and for the F.A. He helped the London Club into the First Division and to reach the Semi Final of the F.A. Cup. Became the most famous chairman of the P'ayers Union and more recently has been Manager of Coventry City with conspicuous success.

NAT LOFTHOUSE is regarded by many as being Englands finest post war centre forward. His 30 goals in 32 matches certainly show him to have been the most successful. Scored six goals in one match for the Football League in 1952 but possibly his finest hour was when he scored the two goals at Wembley in 1958 to win the cup for Bolton. Recompense indeed for playing the supporting role in the Matthews final of 1953.

TOM FINNEY another of Football's great names. Played 76 times for England and scored 30 goals in these matches. By staying with Preston all his career he sacrifized his chances of the major club honours although he helped his club to win Runners-up medals in the League-Championship in 1953 & 1958 and at Wembley in 1954.

BEDFORD JEZZARD's already successful career was cut short by injury. He had had time to become a great favourite at Fulham and played for England on two occasions. TEO DITCHBURN kept goal for the Spurs and England. He was a member of the memo-able Tottenham team of the 1950's which won the Second and First Division Championships in successive seasons.

WALLY BARNES is known to us all as a famous Arsenal captain, and cultured full back. Many times capped for Wales he receives a special welcome today. Is known nowadays as a T.V. Broadcaster. JIMMY SCOULAR and BOB STOKOE both played in the 1955 Newcastle Cup Winning team. Jimmy was capped by Scotland on a number of occasions and is now of course, Manager of the Swans nearest rivals. PAT SAWARD won a Cup medal with Aston Villa in 1957 and was an Eire International many times. NEIL FRANKLYN in the immediate post war years was an automatic choice as England's Centre Half. Sto'te City and Hull City both enjoyed his services.

DEREK UFTON gained one cap for England only, against F.I.F.A. in 1954. He was however the mainstay of the Charlton team in its First Division days and is now in charge at Plymouth.

Today's match is refereed by **JOHN GOW** a Swansea born Football League Official who is tipped for the highest honours. Although now teaching in Birmingham he remains a member of the Swansea Referees Society. He is a son of the late Bill Gow who will be well remembered as a fine Football League Official for many years and a leading local sportsman.

The linesmen Messrs. TOM REYNOLDS and JOHN ALLEN are both Swansea Round Tablers and Welsh League Officials.
